Penile squamous cell carcinoma (PSCC) is an aggressive cancer associated with significant treatment morbidity and psychosocial stress. Metastatic PSCC has a dismal prognosis and its treatment relies on the utilization of conventional treatments employing a multidisciplinary approach. However, there is a paucity of actionable therapeutic or salvage systemic options. Thus, there is an urgent need to expand knowledge on the genomic and molecular landscape of PSCC, as well as increase the awareness of current trials and research on therapeutic paradigms for PSCC. With this Special Issue, we hope to provide a comprehensive and contemporary review on current management strategies for this rare disease.
