### Message from the Guest Editor

This Special Issue focuses on the challenges and aims to provide a comprehensive overview of the unique challenges faced by multicultural couples and their families in different countries and societies. The authors may address challenges in different types of multicultural marriages and families, such as heterosexual and non-heterosexual marriages, de facto marriages, nuclear families, extended families, adoptive families, and single-parent families.
