Furthermore, the development and application of chemical genomic assays using *Saccharomyces cerevisiae* has provided effective methods to identify the mechanism of action of known drugs and novel small molecules *in vivo*. As such, the yeast *Saccharomyces cerevisiae* has served as an important model system for genomic studies.
