Free space optical (FSO) communication has recently received significant attention because of its advantages over its main competitors (i.e., fiber-based RF/microwave communications). including unlicensed spectrum, much higher transmission rate, simplicity of setup, etc. FSO communication is also a highly attractive candidate for solving the 'last-mile' problem. The development of FSO communication will be beneficial to our daily lives, and will also assist us in intersatellite and deep space explorations.
