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Message from the Guest Editor

Dear Colleagues,

The united airway disease interaction comprises allergic rhinosinusitis including allergic rhinitis, eosinophilic chronic rhinosinusitis, and other upper/lower airway disorders such as obstructive sleep apnea, bronchial hyperresponsiveness and allergic asthma. The treatment of chronic allergic rhinosinusitis may reduce obstructive sleep apnea symptoms, chronic cough, or the dose of inhaled corticosteroids necessary to treat asthma, and vice versa.

Many objectives in the interaction concept between allergic rhinosinusitis and airway disease management should be achieved in the near future for reliable control of each disease. More awareness of allergic rhinosinusitis and its comorbidity with other airway diseases must be emphasized in the patients' management programs.
