Additionally, they engage in numerous other intense actions during the game, which often determine its outcome. In recent years, the pace of the game and the number of matches have significantly increased. To cope with this, footballers need to have highly developed physical abilities. The introduction of new technologies (e.g., GPS) in training assists coaches in better managing the demands of designing the microcycle. In developmental ages, special emphasis should be placed on the development of physical abilities, and coaches should exploit the "windows" that appear at each age to contribute to maximizing performance.
