Actions to adapt cities and territories to climate change from spatial planning include specific actions for public works or planning actions in land use planning documents (urban plans, regional plans, sectorial plans or strategic plans). The use of green infrastructure is an effective resource for adaptation to new climate conditions. Climate change adaptation through spatial planning tools include actions to mitigate both the registered trend of increasing temperatures and changes in rainfall (reduction or more intensity), and to solve the effects of extreme atmospheric events that are increasing in the last years.
