The entire textile-production process, from the production of fiber through to the finished garment, poses a significant threat to the environment. The production of sustainable textiles not only helps to lessen the textile industry's harmful impacts on the environment, but it also enables millions of people to receive fair pay and ensures that they are provided with appropriate working conditions. In general, the textile industry creates significant climate changes (SDG 13), water pollution (SDGs 14 and 6), and land pollution (SDG 15) during production, from fiber production to finished garments.

This Special Issue focuses on the significance of using green and sustainable textile materials in all stages of the manufacturing process, from fiber to garment.
