Dear Colleagues,

Since the demand for using recycled materials in soils, concrete, and mortar is rapidly increasing, many non-conventional materials have been recommended for use in these cementitious materials for sustainability reasons. Some of these materials have often been studied by researchers and used in cement and concrete. Thus, the ultimate goal of this Special Issue is to focus on the less studied non-conventional materials.

This Special Issue of *Sustainability* is, therefore, dedicated to comprehensive reviews and original studies on the resource use (e.g., non-renewable energy consumption), environmental impacts (e.g., global potential warming), technical performance (e.g., durability and mechanical), and cost of cementitious materials and concrete containing less common non-conventional materials. Additionally, techniques used or any attempts (listed below, though not exhaustively) to reuse recycled materials as a cement replacement and to reduce concrete resource use and environmental impacts are welcome.
