Environmental viruses are one key factor for microbial mortality, drive diversification and evolution of microbes through gene transfer and are key contributors to the since mineralization of nutrients thev microorganisms by lysis. As a result, they a are important drivers of global biogeochemical cycles. It is thought that most environmental viruses are bacteriophages, i.e. viruses that infect bacteria. However, it is quite possible that viruses that infect (micro)eukaryotes and archaea also play an important role in various ecosystems. Environmental changes may influence virus abundance and the composition of viral communities. These changes may in turn affect population dynamics and the diversity of host organisms that are of importance for many ecosystem functions.

This special issue invites submissions that involve studies about viruses in the environment (e.g. marine, freshwater and soil ecosystems), including virus discovery, virus-host interactions and the consequences of virus infection on ecosystem services.
